Upcoming events

Warmer weather

A reminder that, as the weather improves, the children will need a named

sun hat and named sun cream in school to help keep them safe. Sun cream is extremely important for children. Their skin is much more sensitive than adult skin, and damage caused by repeated exposure to sunlight could lead to skin cancer developing in later life. Rest assured that we will always do our best to keep the children as cool as possible and we take all sensible precautions.

We frequently need to supply our children with swimwear for their sessions if they
